## HISTORICAL NOTE

---

The City Parochial Foundation has its origin in the numerous charitable gifts and bequests made in the course of some 400 years to the then 112 parishes within the City of London, their income to be used for the benefit of the churches or, more often, the poor of those parishes.

With the growth in the nineteenth century of the City as a world financial centre, the income of these charities, many endowed with City properties, had greatly increased, whereas their potentially poor beneficiaries were much reduced in number; some parishes had no residents at all.

On 10 August 1878, a Royal Commission was appointed to investigate the parochial charities of the City of London. Its Report resulted in the City of London Parochial Charities Act 1883.

This Act provided that the largest five parishes should continue to manage their own charitable endowments, but that most of the remaining charities should be administered by a new corporate body, to be known as the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities, with perpetual succession and a Common Seal.

The Act further provided that the Charity Commissioners should prepare Schemes for the proper application of these funds. It defined the area of benefit as the City of

London and the Metropolitan Police District of London. The outcome was a Scheme promulgated in 1891 which brought together all the endowments into two funds, a City Church Fund and a Central Fund. Together these constituted the City Parochial Foundation, with the Trustees under the 1883 Act as the Foundation's Central Governing Body. The Central Fund is the main source of income for distribution for general charitable purposes. The Scheme prohibits grants from the Central Fund for the advancement of religion.

Throughout its history, the Foundation has been guided by two major principles:

- An awareness of, and a need to guard against, the tendency for benefactions intended for the poor to fall into the hands of a somewhat higher income class.
- A concern not to finance schemes which can be financed by local or central Government so that charitable funds are, in effect, used to subsidise the statutory authorities.

Many of the changes in the Foundation's policy since 1891 have resulted from the practical implementation of these principles.

In 1986, the City Parochial Foundation became the Trustee of the new Trust for London, established by the Government after it abolished the Greater London Council. Its initial endowment was £10 million.

From that beginning, the Trust for London has remained distinct in its policies and methods of work, despite its clear links to the Foundation. It has always focused on smaller organisations, making grants to locally-based charitable groups which have no more than the equivalent of two full-time paid members of staff.

The Trust seeks:

- to have an initiating and pro-active role, rather than to wait for applications
- to ensure that its grants have a distinctive and particular impact
- to be accessible to small grants.

# Chairman's foreword

2001 was the last year of our Quinquennium 1997-2001 and we have taken a different approach to our reporting this year. We are publishing *Capital Communities*, a detailed review of our activities over the past five years, and this simpler Grants Review which provides details of our funding over the past 12 months.

It has certainly been a dramatic period, with the appalling events of 11 September 2001 in the United States underlining in dramatic fashion the tensions and divisions in world society. They hit home in our capital with fears of further attacks, and a backlash against Muslims and other entirely innocent groups. Amongst the complex causes of these events, there can be little doubt that poverty and grievances - both real and perceived - played a significant part.

The issues of racism and underprivilege have come to be amongst the major concerns of the Trustees of City Parochial Foundation and Trust for London, and recent events have added to our resolve to do all we can to support those individuals and groups that provide a multiplicity of invaluable services to the poor of the capital.

Several of our programmes came towards fruition during the year, including the Youth programme about which a report was published in August. We held a celebratory event at Ocean in Hackney (a venue to which we have given support) with, appropriately, performances by youth music and dance groups.

We also moved towards completion of the Governance Inquiry, the report of which we believe will provide invaluable help to many small organisations wishing to set up robust structures for decision-making and survival

Improved governance in the voluntary sector will undoubtedly help to ensure proper accountability in line with best practice and trends in other walks of life.

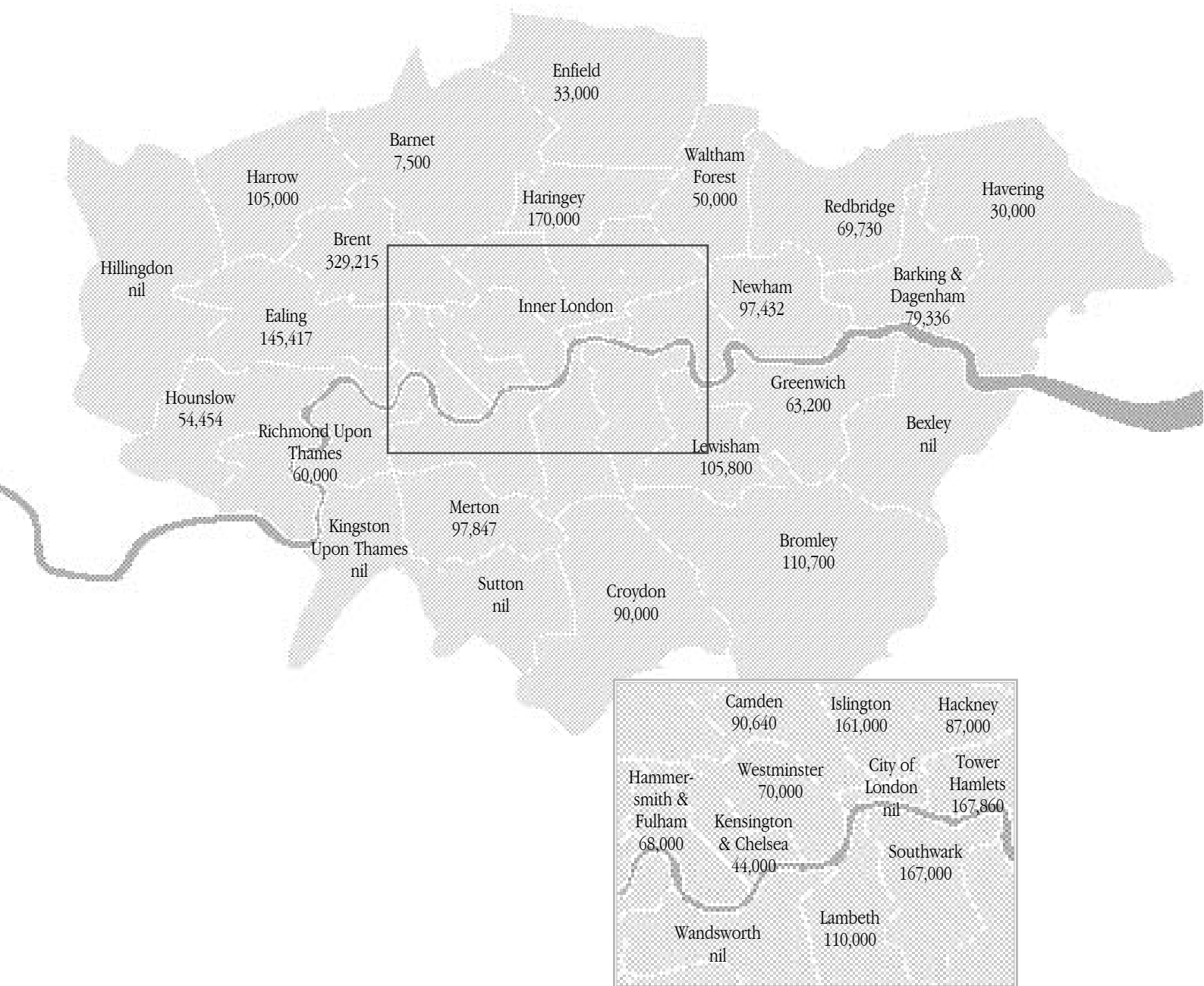
We also celebrated the 'relaunch' of the Resource Centre in Holloway, after the completion of some refurbishment work to ensure that the high quality of its appearance and facilities are maintained, and to mark a closer relationship between the Centre and the Foundation and Trust.

The event was also used to announce our priorities for the next Quinquennium, 2002-2006. As five years ago, we spent much time reviewing our recent experience of grant making, and also talking to voluntary sector groups, public sector organisations and other funders to gain their views on how we should proceed and what issues we should tackle. The guidelines for potential grant applications are published on our web-site or are available from the Foundation's offices.

As ever, the demands for help will outweigh the resources we have available. But experience over the past few years has shown that working with other funders in alliance considerably enhances the contribution we can make, and we shall in part be continuing to pursue our objectives in this way.

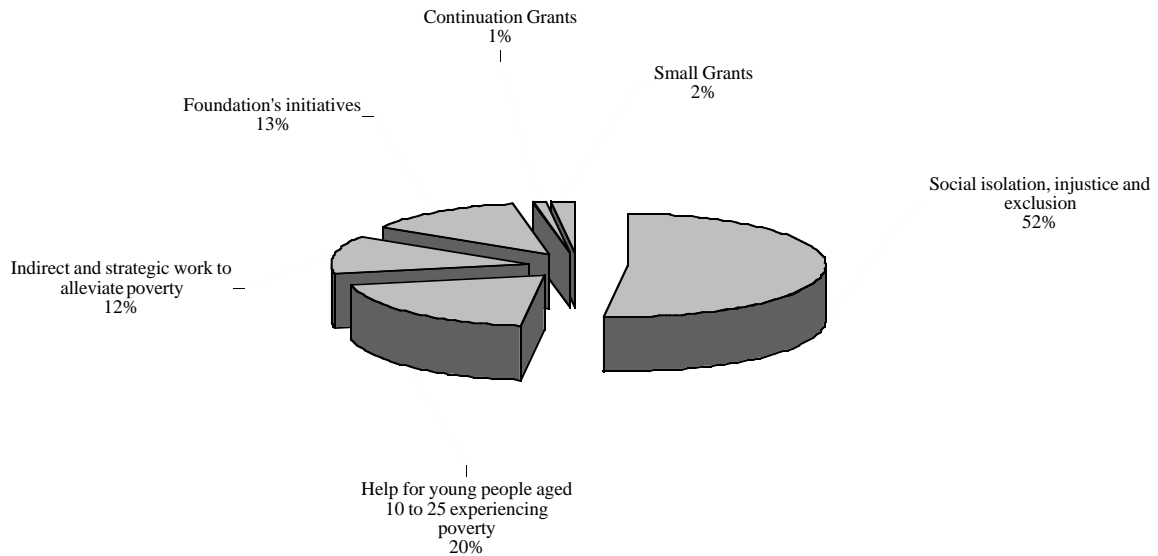

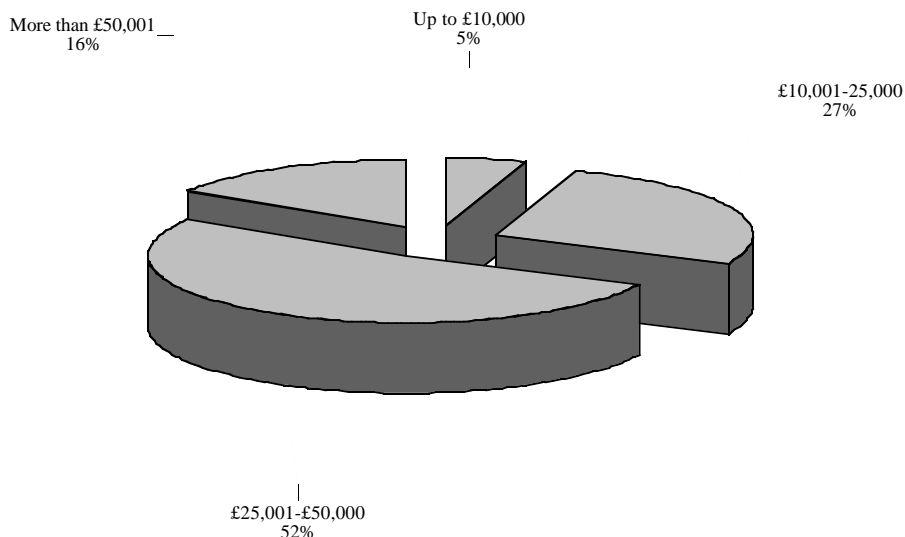
